COUNTY COUNCILLOR'S REPORT

COUNTY COUNCIL BUDGETS 2022/23

Carmarthenshire County Council has approved its budgets for 2022-23, which includes a modest council tax increase to support the delivery of essential frontline services and significant investment in key regeneration projects. Council Tax will increase by 2.5 per cent - roughly 66p a week more for the average band D household, or £34.07 a year. Council Tax contributes around a quarter of the county council's annual revenue budget which is spent on providing services to residents and businesses in Carmarthenshire. The biggest share of Council Tax contributions goes towards education and children's services, followed by housing and adult social care. In 2022-23 the contributions will also help the council cope with inflationary pressures, including increasing energy bills and the rising cost of providing services such as school meals. The capital budget will provide a £275million investment in projects which will include regeneration schemes, redevelopment of schools, leisure facility improvements and advanced waste and recycling schemes.

CARMARTHENSHIRE TEN TOWNS INITIATIVE

The Ten Towns initiative is to support the economic recovery and growth of rural towns across the County. The initiative was established as a direct response to our Moving Rural Carmarthenshire Forward Plan, which sets out a number of key recommendations to support the regeneration of rural Carmarthenshire. A key part of the programme is the development of economic growth plans to drive forward an agenda for change for each of the respective towns and their wider hinterland: Cross Hands, Cwmaman, Kidwelly, Laugharne, Llandeilo, Llandovery, Llanybydder, Newcastle Emlyn, St. Clears and Whitland. Each plan will have their own priority actions, as well as identified projects that will support the economic recovery and growth of each rural town, which will include actions to support: Covid-19 recovery, Business growth, Smart digital towns and countryside, Tourism and visitor economy and Re-use of buildings and land development. I am working with the St. Clears group to set a programme of initiatives which will benefit our area and bring more services to St. Clears town.
